At the October 15, 2020, M.S.A.D. No. 75 Board of Directors meeting, a decision was made to adopt a "feather-in" approach to returning kindergarten through fifth grade students to full in-person instruction four days a week. The current physical distancing requirements impacts the number of students that can be in one classroom space and may result in some classrooms needing to be split. The following dates will be used for returning to in-person instruction for Kindergarten-fifth grade students:

\*Kindergarten and 1st Grade: December 7, 2020

2nd and 3rd Grade: To be determined at the January 14, 2021, Board of

Directors meeting with the potential start of January 19, 2021

4th and 5th Grade: To be determined based on the success of previous

grades "feathering in" to four days a week of in-person instruction.

\*An additional first grade teacher must be hired for WCS in order for first grade students to be able to return to full in-person instruction and meet the physical distancing requirements. We are currently in the process of recruiting and interviewing for this position. Updates regarding this progress will be shared with first grade parents as it becomes available. The staff and I are committed to working together to create as smooth transition as possible for all students involved in the return to full in-person instruction four days a week.

We are quickly approaching Parent/Teacher Conferences. They are scheduled for November 16th through November 24th and will be held via zoom. Each grade level team or teacher will communicate with parents the conference format and schedule conferences. The focus of the first trimester parent/teacher conferences will be on building parent/caregiver partnerships, student performance (strengths and growth opportunities) as

well as goal setting for the next trimester. To help better prepare for your upcoming conference, consider the following:

- \*Talk to your child-Ask if there is anything that he/she would like for you to discuss with the teacher.
- \*Be prepared-Write down things that you would like to discuss/questions that you would like to ask at the conference.
- \*Be specific. Describe your child's strengths and areas of need.
- \*Arrive promptly to your zoom session or a few minutes early.
- \*Exchange information. Feel free to share with the teacher situations in the home that may affect your child's school work (Ex. a new baby in the family, new babysitter, etc.).
- \* Discuss the whole child. Your child's social and emotional development is as important as his/her academic success.
- \* Leave with a plan. The conference should end with a clear statement of what you will do and what the teacher will do.

Thank-you in advance for your support and attendance. Strong, positive and supportive parent/caregiver partnerships are essential to a student's overall school success.

assistance with meals or holiday gifts please call Mr. C or Carin to discuss your family's individual needs.



## **Quick Reminder About Travel Over Thanksgiving**

Maine residents who travel to non-exempt states as well as non-exempt states' residents who travel to Maine **are required** to either quarantine for 14 days or get a negative test. This also applies for day trips (e.g., a trip from Maine to Rhode Island for shopping).

Current exempt states include: New Hampshire, Vermont, and Massachusetts. However, the Maine CDC recommends either quarantine or testing when traveling to or from Massachusetts given its higher prevalence of COVID-19 than in northern New England.
