Thank-you for participating in the recent Parent/Teacher Conferences. Your support is always very appreciated and needed as we work together to provide instructional programming that meets the needs of every student. Here are highlights of things happening around WCS:

Kindergarten & Grade 1 Return to Four Day In-Person Learning Monday, December 7th

A reminder that students in kindergarten and grade one will return to four day in-person learning on Monday, December 7th. This means that students from Cohorts A and B will merge

together and attend school Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. Kindergarten and first grade students will continue to engage in at-home learning activities on Hybrid Wednesdays. Staff and students have been preparing for the potential impact that the increased number of students in classrooms, hallways, playground and buses will have on our school. This will help to ensure safety for all.

Parents/caregivers who provide transportation to and/or from school should anticipate that the arrival and dismissal procedures may take a little more time due to the increased number of students. Our school staff will work together to ensure continued safety in all areas of our school environment but your patience, understanding and support continues to be needed and very appreciated.

Pets: My pets are outside farm animals. We have many chickens that lay eggs, turkeys and a goat named Nay.


Favorite Color: It's hard to pick just one. Orange, yellow and red.
