Hello WCS Community!

Here are highlights and updates of things taking place at WCS:

Spread Love Not Germs Project

This week and next week WCS students are engaging in a special Valentine's project that is meant to support and promote hope and gratitude in our community. Hearts like the one pictured above are being posted on classroom doors randomly each day. When a heart is posted on a classroom door, the class will engage in creating and implementing a special project that spreads love, kindness, hope and/or gratitude in the WCS community. Students will invite me (Mrs. Rineer) to their classrooms to share and report out on their projects. In turn, I will have a special surprise for each student.

Phase 3 Feathering-In: Grades 4 & 5

Students in grades four and five are scheduled to transition into full time, four day per week learning on Monday, February 22nd. This change will take place pending that our county is still in "green" status as per Maine State Governor Janet Mills. At this time we anticipate having two sections of fourth grade and two sections of fifth grade with fourteen students in each classroom. This is the maximum number of students that can safely be accommodated in the lower Cone level classrooms as per the Maine Department of Education's safety guidelines.

Students will not change homeroom or teacher assignments. However, the fourth and fifth grade teams and I are very aware of the social, emotional and academic changes that our students will potentially experience as a result of cohorts merging together. Therefore; we will work together to ensure a positive and smooth transition for all.



The return to full time in person four day per week learning for grades four and five beginning February 22nd will require some additional adjustments to our arrival and dismissal routines and schedules due to the increase in the daily student population. **Safety for all is our**priority. We will once again need a lot of patience and grace as we transition to higher volumes of students. To assist us in ensuring a safe, timely and smooth arrival and dismissal we ask that parents/caregivers continue to support and adhere to the following:

Morning Arrival:

*Students should exit their automobiles independently and as quickly as possible so as not to hold up the arrival process. If your child is unable to exit your automobile independently, please park in the WCS parking lot and assist your child. Parents/caregivers (wearing face coverings) must walk their child to the Main Entrance. *This procedure should only be utilized by students who cannot exit their automobile independently.*

End of Day Dismissal:

*Students should enter their automobiles independently and as quickly as possible so as not to hold up the dismissal process. If your child is unable to enter your automobile independently, please enter into the car rider line so a member of the Arrival/Dismissal Team can call for your student(s). Continue through the car rider line, then park in the WCS parking lot.

Parents/caregivers (wearing face coverings) must physically meet their child at the crosswalk area and walk his/her student(s) through the parking lot to his/her automobile. *This procedure should only be utilized by students who cannot enter their automobile independently.

Inclement Weather Procedures

As we venture through the winter months, inclement weather (especially in Maine!) is pretty much a given. Please review the new inclement weather procedures that have been adopted by our school district this year:

Remote Learning Day Due to Inclement Weather for Option #1 Students

- All students scheduled for in-person activities will activate the remote schedule provided by their teacher(s)/school.
- Families or students who have isolated power or internet loss will be marked excused absence and be allowed to make up any missed work without penalty. Parents or students are expected to communicate their particular situation of loss of power/internet with the classroom teacher(s) as soon as possible (once power/internet is back on) via email or phone.
- Teachers and paraprofessionals assigned will be working regular hours remotely.
- All activities that require any form of transportation will be canceled. Virtual activities and meetings would be held unless there is a specific need to cancel.
- Students should use the storm food package (shelf-stable) that is available through our nutrition program. These storm packets contain breakfast and lunch.

<u>In the event that the Superintendent calls for a School Closure the following</u> <u>will take place:</u>

- All school classes, activities, and meetings scheduled in-person or remote (including
 Option 2 classes) will be canceled.
- These days will need to be made up. Day(s) will be added at the end of the school year to make up for the canceled day.
- All after-school athletics, activities, and meetings will be canceled.
- This is the typical "snow day."
- Students should use the storm food package (shelf-stable) that is available through our nutrition program. These storm packets contain breakfast and lunch.

Communication:

A Remote Learning Day or School Closure day will be communicated via School Messenger by phone, text, and email as well as the District website and Facebook page and in addition to news Channels 6, 8, and 13. If you have not signed up for texts/emails, please contact your school office.

Covid-19 cases in Maine have risen rapidly in the past weeks. Here are some reminders to help keep our school community safe and healthy.

- Let the health office know if your student is sick with Covid-19 symptoms, or has tested positive for the virus.
- Stay home and quarantine immediately if identified as a close contact to someone testing positive to Covid-19.
- Follow Governor Mills' executive order for testing/quarantining if your family travels out of Maine to non exempt states.
- Continue to wear face coverings, wash hands, maintain social distance, and stay home when sick.




10th Annual CLYNK for Schools Recycling Challenge

The box tops clippings are becoming more few and far between as they transition the program to be fully digital.




