Spring break has come and gone and it's been quite a week for Option #1 students and families since returning from break!

The quick transition from Plan A (full-time in person learning) to Plan C (full-time remote learning) was unanticipated and overwhelming for all of us. I am pleased to share that that all Option #1 PreK through grade twelve students will return to full time in person learning on Monday, May 3rd. The school district has been able to secure the necessary bus drivers to provide the needed transportation for all Option 1 (in-person) students in grades PreK-12 to return to their regular school schedules on Monday, May 3rd.

As a parent I know how challenging it was for families to rearrange school and work schedules, secure childcare, make alternate plans, etc. While I am sure that families will be glad to return to in-person learning on Monday, I know that many families will once again be required to spend time rearranging plans, schedules, etc. On behalf of the WCS staff and myself, thank-you for your continued understanding, support and flexibility. It is so very much appreciated.

Maine Educational Assessment 2021

The Maine Educational Assessments (MEA) includes required assessments in Mathematics, English Language Arts (ELA)/Literacy, and Science. For the 2020-21 administration, Maine will be using the NWEA for grades 3-8 and third-year high school students in Mathematics and ELA/Literacy. Students in grades 5, 8 and third year of high school will participate in the Maine Science assessment. Students in grades 3-8 and third year of high school with the most significant cognitive disabilities will continue to participate in the Multi-State Alternate Assessment (MSAA) to assess Mathematics and ELA/Literacy and the MSAA Science which aligns to the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS). All assessments are administered online.


*WCS will be administering the NWEA to students in grades three through five during the week of May 10th through May 17th.

CoGat Assessment 2021

Due to the transition to remote learning we felt that it was necessary to examine our upcoming Spring assessments and adjust. Spring is already a very busy time in our schools and with upcoming NWEA/MEA tests we made the decision to reschedule the CoGat (Cognitive Abilities Test) to September.

What does this mean? This assessment will continue to be utilized by the district as one of the qualification criteria for Gifted and Talented. We will continue to identify students. Teacher's recommendations will still be a large part of the process this spring. Additionally we will still do the test but instead of in 2nd and 5th grade this spring we will conduct it in 3rd and 6th grade the third week of September. You will also not receive a letter describing your child's results this spring, again you will receive that next fall. This is the same adjustment that we did this year 20-21 as a result of the pandemic and our closure last spring.

You will receive a letter two weeks before this testing next fall to orient you on the process. We feel that this adjustment is a prudent decision that allows us to focus on our required NWEA/MEA assessment and also allows us to focus on inperson learning which we agree is the most important focus at this time. Thank you for your understanding and support!




In an effort to increase access to high-quality early childhood learning opportunities for students prior to entering Kindergarten, M.S.A.D. No. 75 provides two PreK classes, for a total of 32 students. Students must be 4 years old by October 15, 2021. The program uses the same calendar as grades K-12, runs five days a week and approximately 6 hours per day. Transportation is not provided. One class is at the Williams-Cone School in Topsham, while the other is at Midcoast Maine Community Action's (MMCA) Head Start location at Cook's

Corner in Brunswick.
