#### Phonics/Spelling Pilot Programs

Phonological and phonemic awareness along with spelling skills are some of the most important stepping-stones in early literacy. When children are familiar with the sounds that the letters make, they are able to use them when reading, to segment and blend words together.

Our district is piloting several phonics/spelling programs this year in kindergarten through grade three including UFLI Foundations, Fundations and Bridge to Reading (Project Read). Below you will find an example of a "sound wall" from the UFLI Foundations program that is being used in a WCS kindergarten classroom. Staff have been receiving professional development to support this implementation since the beginning of the school year. All of the programs are research based, multi-sensory and systematic in their approach to teaching phonics and spelling.

WinterKids, the non-profit organization dedicated to helping children develop healthy lifelong habits through education and fun outdoor winter activities, will select 16 schools (one per Maine county) to compete in the 4-week competition taking place from January 8-February 2, 2024. Competitive track winners will be announced on November 10, 2023.

The Winter Games is a fun, academic challenge promoting outdoor physical activity, teamwork, and a love of all things winter for children in grades Preschool through 8. Each of the four weeks has a different focus-outdoor physical activity, nutrition, family engagement, and winter celebration, with schools earning points to win cash prizes. #### Final Thoughts....



Safety was the major focus of the October 6th district in-service. Staff were trained in the following areas: situational awareness, how to act during a crisis situation and how to support our community members during the recovery phase of a crisis situation. While the training was intensive at times, our staff was very focused and displayed a remarkable level of engagement, genuine desire to learn and understand how to respond effectively in the event of a crisis situation. As the year progresses we will continue to provide safety training to staff. We will also work on the next steps of student training and will do this in a trauma-informed and age-appropriate manner. More information will be shared as it becomes available.


