*NWEA Leadership & Support

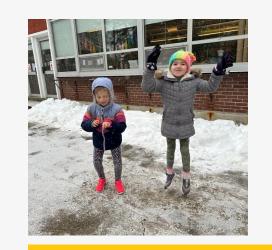

Lack of Staffing

Like all schools, WCS faced many challenges and setbacks during the Covid-19 pandemic. A particular setback was in the signifiant lack of special education and intervention staffing during the 2020-21 and 2021-22 school years.

Inconsistent Teaching & Learning

Students in grades two through four received inconsistent academic programming for up to a three year period due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

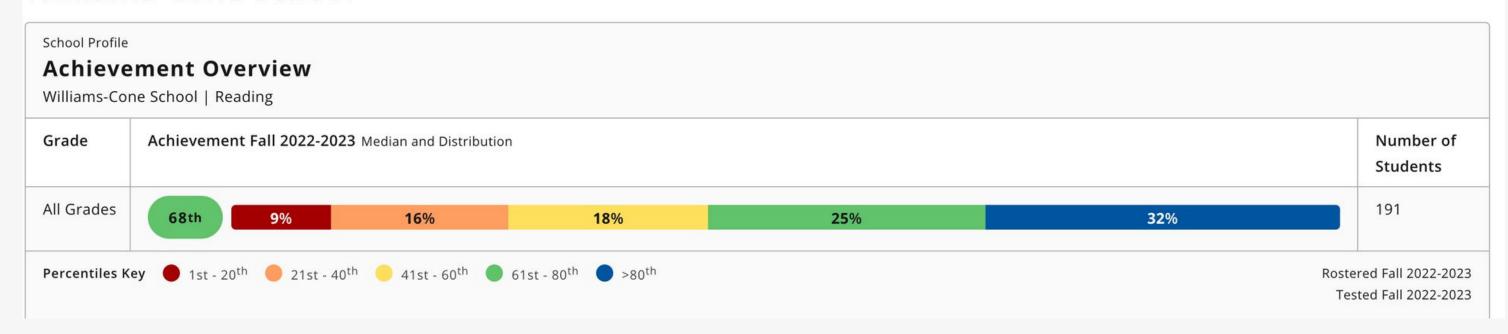
Childhood Trauma

We have witnessed and experienced a significant increase of students with 1 or more Adverse Childhood Experiences. At least 50% of all WCS have at least 1 or more ACES.

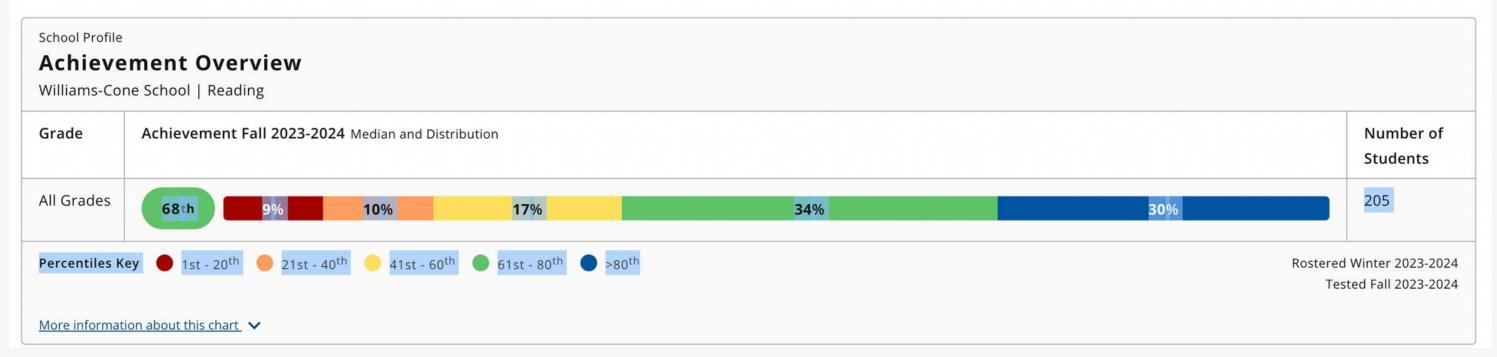

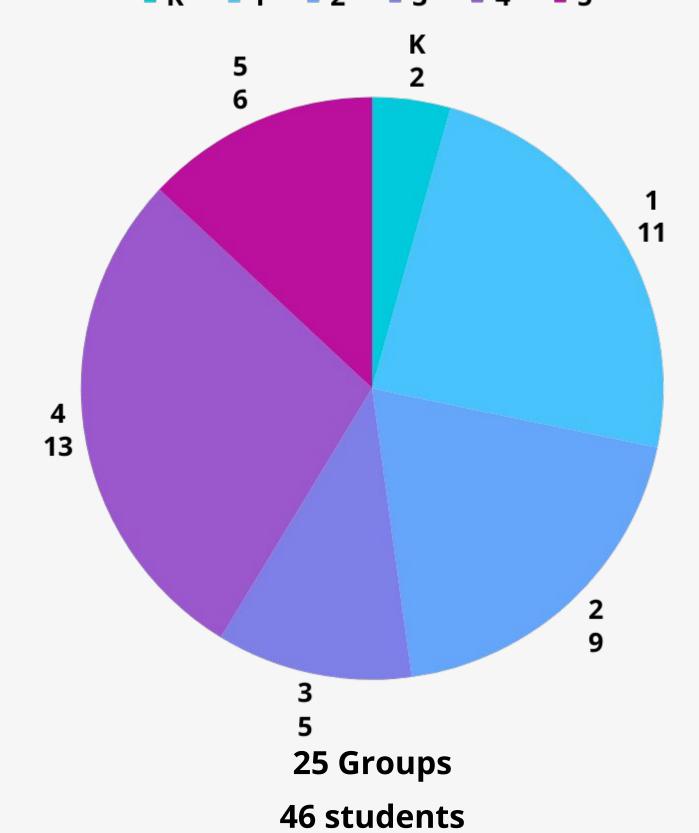

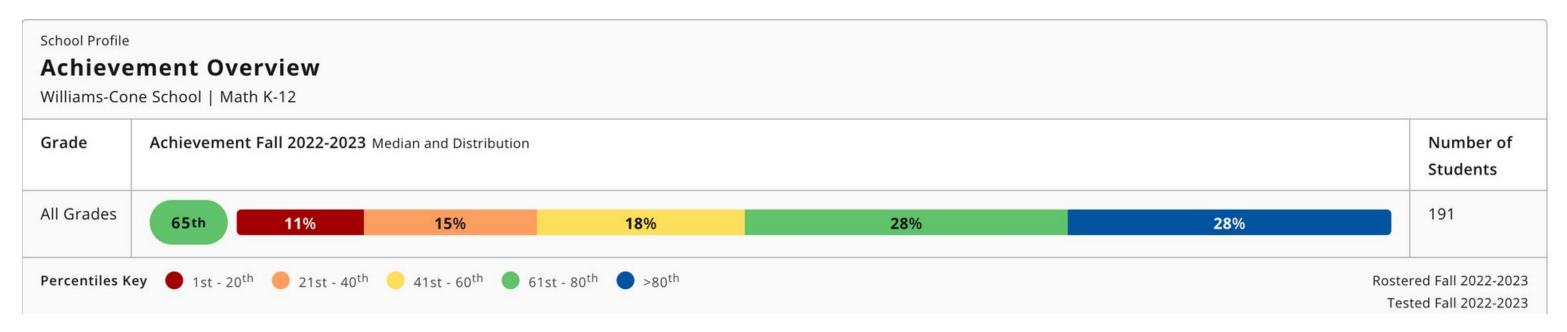


RTI-LITERACY # OF STUDENTS PER GRADE LEVEL CURRENTLY RECEIVING RTI-A SUPPORT

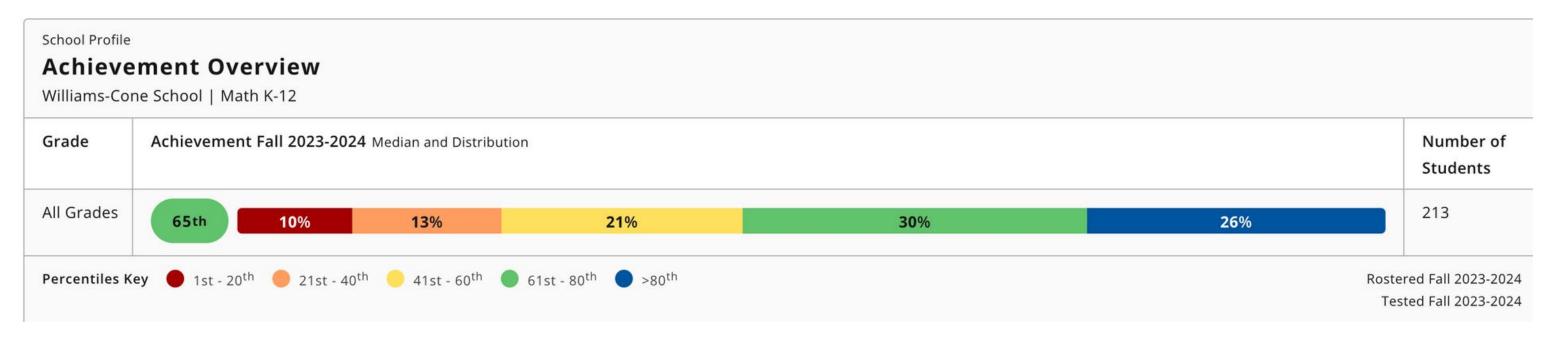

MATH AREAS OF INSTRUCTIONAL CONCERN

Closing the gap of students who fall below the 61st percentile.

Grade 4:

*Grade 4's math achievement has a class median average that is at the 61st percentile, which is a total of 14 students below the 50th percentile. This falls below the overall school median of 65%. Current breakdown of supports for students in this range:

Fall 2022- 56% of the students fell below this range.

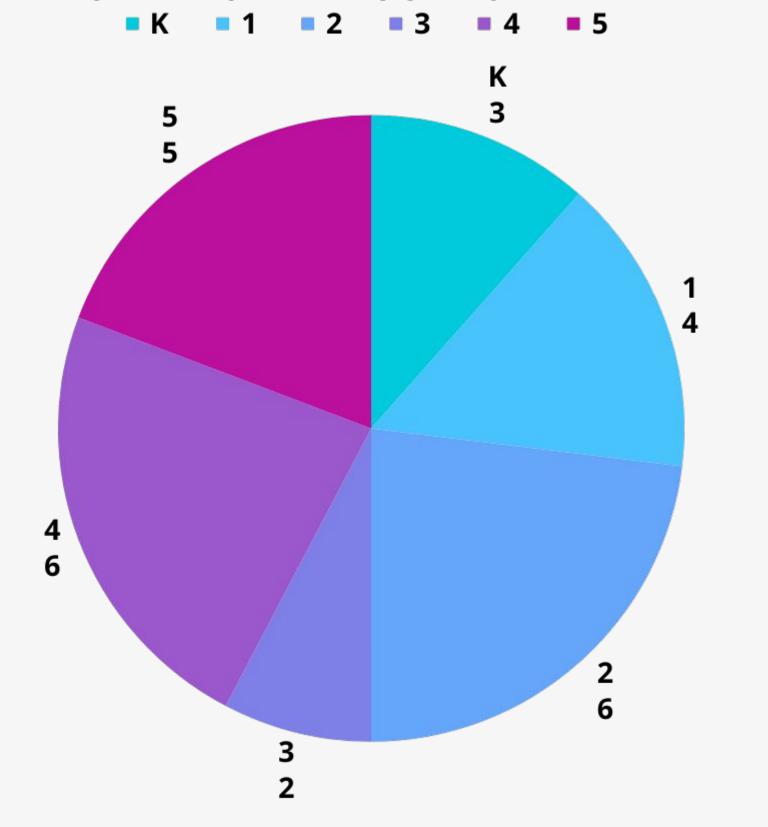

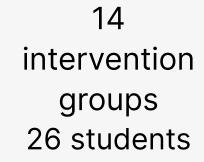

RTI-A JUSTIFICATION

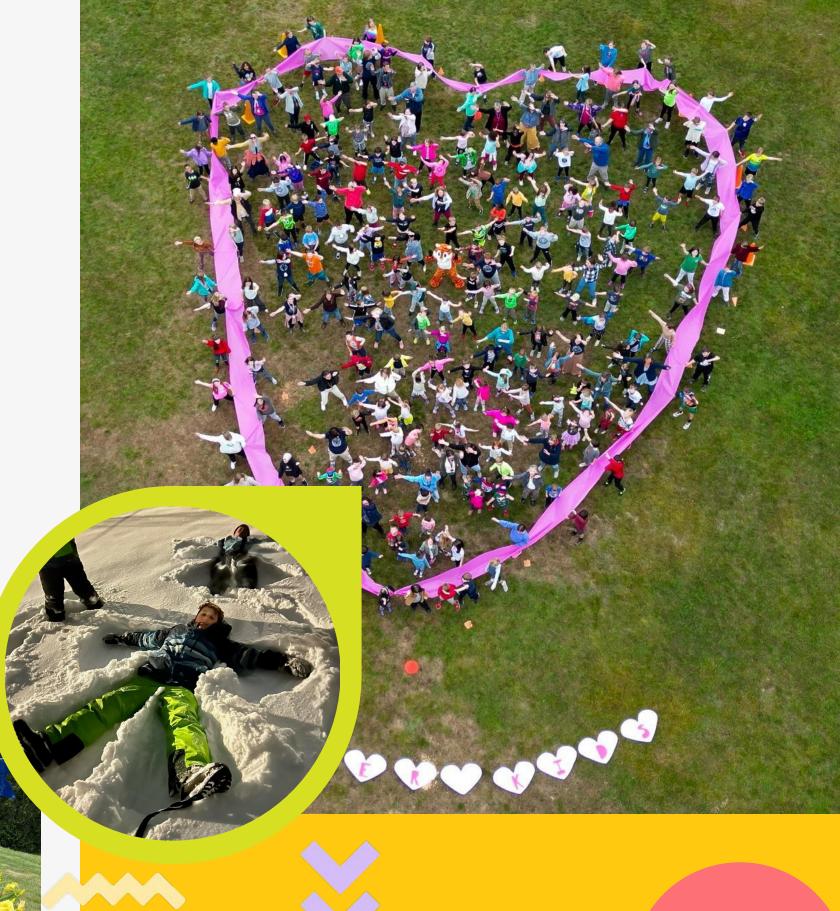
A 1.0 RTI-A teacher is needed for the 2024-2025 school year to address the literacy and math needs of students identified for RTI services and support with a focus on grades two and four.

This is due to the documented needs presented through multiple data measures including NWEA scores, running records, Lexia, EDMI, curriculum based measures and teacher observation.

2024-25 GOAL

80% of all K-5 WCS students will score in the 50%tile or higher range in achievement on the Spring 2025 math and reading NWEA.

This is below the district minimum of 14

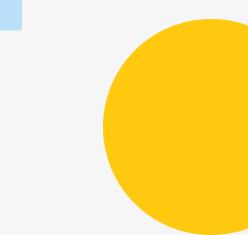
2024-25 Enrollment Projections
